The Eastern Mass Soccer Clinic was founded in 1982 by legendary high school soccer coaches Don Brock (Needham High School) and Peter Loiter (Wellesley High School). Throughout its 30 years, EMSC has maintained the same commitment to excellence.

Program Options

Half-Day Primary Program

- **Preschool-3rd grade**
- **Offered August 8-12 and August 15-19, 2011**
- **Cost- \$220/week**

The Primary Clinic is a half-day program designed to instruct younger players on fundamental skills, small-sided play, and teamwork.



Full-Day Program

- **3rd-10th Grade**
- **Offered August 8-12, 2011**
- **Cost- \$340/week**

Clinic Program: This program is focused on the understanding of the tactics and techniques of the game using functional training methods, individual ball work, small and larger sided games. This session also places emphasis on team building.

Advanced Players Session: This program is designed to simulate the demands of high-level high school and intercollegiate training. It is limited to players entering 8th-10th grade.

Goalkeeper Training: Directed by experienced goalkeeper specialists, this is a separate, skill-based program for goalkeepers of all levels.

EMSC Director

Steve Ginsberg



Steve Ginsberg is in his 12th year as the Director of EMSC. He has been involved with soccer, as a player and a coach, in the Greater Boston area for over twenty years.

Ginsberg is currently the boys' varsity coach at the Noble and Greenough School in Dedham. During his eleven years as the coach of the boys' and girls' varsity teams, he has a combined record of 126-31-23. His teams have won five Independent School League Titles and a New England Class A Championship. Ginsberg has also coached the men's teams at Hobart College and the Northfield Mount Hermon School.

A Needham native and former captain at Needham High School, Ginsberg went on to play four years at Williams College, where he served as a captain in 1994. During his time at Williams, the Ephs advanced to the NCAA National Championship game and were ranked number one in the country.

Ginsberg holds an Advanced National Diploma from the National Soccer Coaches of America and a Masters in Sports Management from the University of Massachusetts - Amherst.
